#### CD DECORATION – CLASSES 1 & 2



# TRIPS & TOURS

#### Vikram Sarabhai Space Research Centre

The students of class IV and V visited the prestigious Vikram Sarabhai Space Research centre on 11<sup>th</sup> December. It was an excellent learning opportunity where they saw different innovations in the field of Robotics. The faculty of Chemistry spoke about acid, bases and salts. The students also read about the presence of science in nature.



Field Trip to Vikram Sarabhai Space Exhibition

The students of the Class VII went to the Vikram Sarabhai Space Exhibition which was an ongoing exhibition showing the achievements of ISRO and SAC in the development of India's Space Programme on 14<sup>th</sup> November. The students were first shown a few short films dealing with the Mangalayan Mission (MOM), the assembly, the launching of PSLV and GSLV rockets from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota and the uses of the various satellites. After and interactive question answer session, the students were taken around the exhibition rooms where they were shown various parts of the satellite.

#### Khoj Museum

On the 27<sup>th</sup> September, Students of classes VIII to XII went to visit the Khoj Museum in Naranpura and was an amazing experience. The theme of this museum changes every nine months. The museum has three floors and each floor included models and experiments related to different topics. This time the topics were astronomy, moving images and bubbles. The astronomy section consisted of a sun dial, a star dial models related to how day and night, solar eclipse and lunar eclipse are formed. The students also learnt about different constellations. The moving images consisted of how small differences in images can make a moving film. The most interesting part was the bubbles. The soap solution which they used was different as they used hard water instead of normal water.



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#### Industrial Visit

Educational visit has its own importance in the career of a student. It is considered as a part of school curriculum. Objective of such visit is to provide students with an insight regarding internal working of companies. An Industrial visit to Safe Xpress was organized on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2018 for the students of Economics (Class IX and X) and Commerce (Class XI and XII). Ninety students visited Safe-Xpress to understand the working of the company and to study various factors of production employed in the firm. The head of Safe-Xpress conducted very informative session for the students. The interaction with him was concluded with a question /answer session. The visit to Safe Xpress provided our students a practical perspective in the world of work. This visit helped them to combine theoretical knowledge with industrial knowledge.



#### Plant Tissue Culture Workshop

## Junior Annual Day Celebrations


Zydus School for Excellence, Vejalpur celebrated the Junior Annual Day (Jr.KG to Class II) with great fervor.

This letter is to confirm that Aahna Shah was a student on our English Literature & Creative Writing summer course, from 24/06/2018 until 7/07/2018. The teaching was carried out in small-group seminars and tutorials by Audrey Southgate.

In my capacity as Director I did not directly teach Aahna Shah, but I found them to be a conscientious and personable student.

The course tutor, Audrey, has written the following report on Aahna Shah's performance:

It was a pleasure to teach Aahna, in large part because of her consistently cheerful and dedicated attitude to the course. The course was a challenging one, as we surveyed English literature and particularly English poetry from the early Anglon-Saxon works to the modernist poet Ezra Pound, with everything from the medieval tales of Chaucer to Shakespeare's Tempest to romantic and Victorian poetry in between; Aahna met this challenge with a smile and thrived throughout her two weeks here. Not only did she use her previous foundation of knowledge and the instruction in how to analyse poetic form and content to better understand other authors through their work; she also produced some delightful creative work of her own. The tale she wrote effectively used the genres of tragedy and exemplum we had observed in the Canterbury Tales to communicate a moral; even before this, the riddle she wrote in imitation of the Anglo-Saxon style was a delight for the whole class to hear and try to solve. Aahna again delighted the class with some dramatic performances. She played the sprite Ariel in Act 2, scene 1, of The Tempest with great liveliness, even singing in the scene. Likewise, her final project, a performance of Ariel's songs in The Tempest from memory, reflected their lyricism and the change in tone between these poems. Her attitude of wanting to share what she learned with her whole school back home is admirable. I believe that between her creative work here and her experience in Oxford as a whole, she will have ample material to present to her school newspaper!

I should note that due to the short time frame of the course, we do not ask students to sit a final exam, nor require tutors to give a final grade.


